#### Archaeology in Mongolia: Protecting Threatened Cultural Heritage

Dr. Julia Clark, Founding Director, NOMAD Science Mongolia

ABSTRACT Mongolia has a rich archaeological history that goes back at least 40,000 years and includes paleolithic hunter-gatherers, Bronze and Iron Age horse mounted warriors, Genghis Khan at the head of the Mongol Empire, the largest land empire the world has ever seen, and much more. Unfortunately, there are many threats to the integrity of these irreplaceable and priceless cultural resources. In this talk, Dr. Julia Clark will give an overview of the kinds of cultural resources that are found in Mongolia, what kinds of threats exist for them, and what the research and salvage team at NOMAD Science is doing to protect and study them. Finally, Julia will discuss opportunities for UMW staff, students, and volunteers to get involved in this exciting research.

BIO Dr. Clark is an anthropological archaeologist specializing in the investigation of humanenvironment and human-animal relationships, risk management strategies in marginal environments, and socio-political organization. Many of her projects prioritize salvage archaeology related to threats such as looting, climate change, and under-resourced infrastructure.
